I, Catherine S. Blinn, being first duly sworn upon oath, declare as follows:

1. I am over eighteen years of age and competent to testify. I am an assistant director of elections in the Office of the Secretary of State of Washington. The information stated below is true and correct and of my own knowledge.

2. Attached as **Exhibit A** to this declaration is a true and correct copy of the ballot, and ballot insert, used in Kittitas County at the August 2010 primary.

3. Attached as **Exhibit B** to this declaration is a true and correct copy of the ballot, and ballot insert, used in Snohomish County at the August 2010 primary.

4. I have examined the ballots used in all 39 Washington counties for the August 2010 primary. Every county, with the exception of the Kittitas County ballot attached as Exhibit A, included the language required by WAC 434-230-015, which reads:

READ: Each candidate for partisan office may state a political party that he or she prefers. A candidate's preference does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party, or that the party approves of or associates with that candidate.

5. Every county, including Kittitas County, included with their mail ballots the insert required by WAC 434-250-040, which reads:

Washington has a new primary. You do not have to pick a party. In each race, you may vote for any candidate listed. The two candidates who receive the most votes in the August primary will advance to the November general election.

Each candidate for partisan office may state a political party that he or she prefers. A candidate's preference does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party, or that the party approves of or associates with that candidate

1 6. I have also reviewed the general election ballots, or sample ballots, for the 2010
2 general election from all 39 counties. All of them include the language required by WAC
3 434-230-015.

If you have damaged or lost your ballot, you may request a Replacement Ballot by contacting the Kittitas County Auditor's Office at 962-7503.

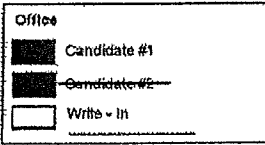
>Returning Your Ballot:

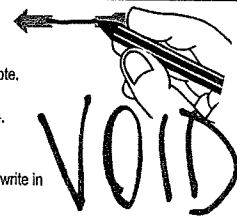
