2009 Supporting Student Success Competitive Grants

Washington schools are required to report on their implementation of Social Studies Classroom Based Assessment (CBA) as a result of the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 28A.230.095. The Supporting Student Success project focuses on the library's role in supporting the CBA research process.

The Supporting Student Success project seeks to improve students' ability to effectively complete CBA requirements, specifically social studies. It encourages collaborative efforts among libraries, learners, and schools through information literacy activities, opportunities, and demonstration projects.
