2014 Broadband Grants

The purpose of the Broadband grant cycle is to provide grant funds to public and tribal libraries associated with a Round One or Two ARRA Broadband (NTIA BTOP) awarded to the Northwest Open Access Network (NoaNet). Funds will be used to allow the libraries to upgrade or add network hardware and software to take advantage of this enhanced broadband.

Overall funding to support this grant cycle is \$150,000. This grant cycle has a limit of \$10,000 per application.
