

SECRETARY OF STATE STATE OF WASHINGTON

AN ACT Relating to election petitions; and amending RCW 29A.24.091.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

3 Sec. 1. RCW 29A.24.091 and 2009 c 106 s 2 are each amended to read 4 as follows:

- (1) A filing fee of ten dollars shall accompany the declaration of candidacy for any office with a fixed annual salary of one thousand dollars or less; a filing fee equal to one percent of the annual salary of the office at the time of filing shall accompany the declaration of candidacy for any office with a fixed annual salary of more than one thousand dollars per annum. No filing fee need accompany a declaration of candidacy for precinct committee officer or any office for which compensation is on a per diem or per meeting attended basis.
- (2) A candidate who lacks sufficient assets or income at the time of filing to pay the filing fee required by this section shall submit with his or her declaration of candidacy a filing fee petition. ((The petition shall contain not less than a number of signatures of registered voters equal to the number of dollars of the filing fee. The signatures shall be of voters registered to vote within the jurisdiction of the office for which the candidate is filing.))

- 1 (a) For a statewide office, the petition shall contain the 2 signatures of five hundred registered voters of the state of 3 Washington.
 - (b) For the office of the United States house of representatives, the petition shall contain the signatures of two hundred registered voters of the jurisdiction that the candidate would represent.
 - (c) For all other offices, including state, county, or local offices, the petition shall contain the signatures of fifty registered voters of the jurisdiction that the candidate would represent.
 - (3) When the candidacy is for:

- $((\frac{1}{1}))$ (a) A statewide office, the United States senate, or the United States house of representatives, the fee shall be paid to the secretary of state;
- $((\frac{1}{2}))$ <u>(b)</u> A legislative or judicial office that includes territory from more than one county, the fee shall be paid to the secretary of state for equal division between the treasuries of the counties comprising the district;
- $((\frac{3}{3}))$ (c) A legislative or judicial office that includes territory from only one county, the fee shall be paid to the county auditor;
- $((\frac{4}{}))$ $\underline{(d)}$ A city or town office, the fee shall be paid to the county auditor who shall transmit it to the city or town clerk for deposit in the city or town treasury.
- (4) If after filing a petition in lieu of the filing fee, a candidate's economic standing for eligibility to file by petition is challenged by a registered voter from the jurisdiction in which the candidate would represent, the candidate shall be immediately notified by the election official receiving the petition. The candidate shall file an affidavit, which represents that his or her liquid assets do not total more than ten times the amount of the filing fee for the office for which he or she is filing. The affidavit may or may not include specific information about the candidate's financial accounts, other than the type of account and the approximate amount that each
