## INITIATIVE 356

I, Sam Reed, Secretary of State of the State of Washington and custodian of its seal hereby certify that, according to the records on file in my office, the attached copy of Initiative Measure No. 356 to the Legislature is a true and correct copy as it was received by this office.

- AN ACT Relating to elections; amending RCW 29A.08.210, 29A.08.110,
- 2 and 29A.08.615; adding new sections to chapter 29A.08 RCW; adding a new
- 3 section to chapter 29A.04 RCW; creating new sections; and repealing RCW
- 4 29A.08.010.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** FINDINGS. The people of the state of Washington find as follows:
- 8 Voting is a citizen's precious right, and one that is violated
- 9 every time an ineligible voter is allowed to cast a ballot or an
- 10 eligible voter is prevented from casting a ballot. State and local
- 11 election officials must protect the integrity of Washington elections
- 12 by ensuring our registration rolls contain only eligible citizens.
- 13 This commonsense measure to help prevent our elections from being
- 14 corrupted by fraud will restore integrity to the ballot box.
  - Ensure Only Eligible Citizens Are Registered to Vote
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 29A.08 RCW
- 17 to read as follows:

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- 1 "FULL LEGAL NAME." As used in this chapter, "full legal name"
- 2 means the voter's full name at birth, including first, middle, and last
- 3 name, or the voter's full name as legally changed by a court of law or
- 4 by marriage.

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- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 29A.08 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- DOCUMENTS THAT DEMONSTRATE CITIZENSHIP. Proof of citizenship may be demonstrated by any of the following documents:
- 9 (1) A birth certificate that verifies citizenship to the 10 satisfaction of the county auditor or secretary of state;
  - (2) A United States passport identifying the applicant and the applicant's passport number;
  - (3) A United States naturalization document or the number of the certificate of naturalization. If only the number of the certificate of naturalization is provided, the applicant shall not be included in the registration rolls until the county auditor or secretary of state verifies the number of the certificate of naturalization with the United States bureau of citizenship and immigration services or another appropriate federal agency;
- 20 (4) The applicant's bureau of Indian affairs card number, tribal treaty card number, or tribal enrollment number;
- 22 (5) Other documents or methods of proof that are authorized under 23 the federal immigration reform and control act of 1986; or
- 24 (6) Documents identified by the United States department of state 25 and published in the Code of Federal Regulations as acceptable 26 documentary evidence of United States citizenship or nationality for a 27 United States passport application.
- 28 **Sec. 4.** RCW 29A.08.210 and 2005 c 246 s 11 are each amended to 29 read as follows:
- 30 <u>(1)</u> An applicant for voter registration shall complete an 31 application providing the following information concerning his or her 32 qualifications as a voter in this state:
- $((\frac{1}{1}))$  (a) The <u>residential</u> address of the last former registration of the applicant as a voter in the state;
- 35  $((\frac{(2)}{2}))$  (b) The applicant's full <u>legal</u> name;
- $((\frac{3}{3}))$  (c) The applicant's date of birth;

- (((4))) (d) The address of the applicant's residence for voting 2 purposes;
- $((\frac{(5)}{(5)}))$  (e) The mailing address of the applicant if that address is not the same as the address in subsection  $((\frac{(4)}{(4)}))$  (1)(d) of this section;
  - $((\frac{(6)}{(6)}))$  (f) The sex of the applicant;

- ((<del>(7)</del>)) (<u>q)</u> The applicant's Washington state driver's license number or Washington state identification card number, or the last four digits of the applicant's Social Security number if he or she does not have a Washington state driver's license or Washington state identification card;
- ((<del>(8)</del>)) (h) A check box for the applicant to indicate that he or she does not have a Washington state driver's license, Washington state identification card, or Social Security number;
- $((\frac{(9)}{)})$  (i) A check box allowing the applicant to indicate that he or she is a member of the armed forces, national guard, or reserves, or that he or she is an overseas voter;
- $((\frac{10}{10}))$  (j) A check box allowing the applicant to confirm that he or she is at least eighteen years of age;
  - (((11))) (k) Clear and conspicuous language, designed to draw the applicant's attention, stating that the applicant must be a United States citizen in order to register to vote, that the applicant must submit the documents described in subsection (2) of this section with the application, and that the county auditor or secretary of state must reject the application if the applicant fails to include these documents;
  - $((\frac{12}{12}))$  (1) A check box and declaration confirming that the applicant is a citizen of the United States;
    - $((\frac{(13)}{(13)}))$  (m) The following warning:
  - "If you knowingly provide false information on this voter registration form or knowingly make a false declaration about your qualifications for voter registration you will have committed a class C felony that is punishable by imprisonment for up to five years, a fine of up to ten thousand dollars, or both."
    - $((\frac{14}{14}))$  (n) The following affirmation by the applicant:
- "By signing this document, I hereby assert, under penalty of perjury, that I am legally eligible to vote. If I am found to have voted illegally, I may be prosecuted and/or fined for this illegal act. In addition, I hereby acknowledge that my name and last known address

will be forwarded to the appropriate state and/or federal authorities if I am found to have voted illegally."

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 $((\frac{(15)}{(15)}))$  (o) The oath required by RCW 29A.08.230 and a space for the applicant's signature; and

 $((\frac{16}{16}))$  (p) Any other information that the secretary of state determines is necessary to establish the identity of the applicant and prevent duplicate or fraudulent voter registrations.

This information shall be recorded on a single registration form to be prescribed by the secretary of state.

- (2) The applicant must submit copies of the following documents with the registration form:
- (a) A legible copy of a document proving United States citizenship;and
- 14 (b) If a felon, a legible copy of a document proving voting rights
  15 have been restored.

The county auditor, registration assistants, and persons or organizations who collect voter registration forms must provide copying service at no charge to applicants who provide original documents in person. Persons who register by mail must include copies of original documents with their applications.

- (3) After two years, the county auditor or secretary of state may destroy all documents required by subsection (2) of this section that were submitted with the registration form.
- (4) If the applicant fails to provide the information required for voter registration, the auditor shall send the applicant a verification notice. The applicant may not be registered until the required information is provided. If a verification notice is returned as undeliverable or the applicant fails to respond to the notice within forty-five days, the applicant shall not be registered to vote until the applicant completes a new form and provides all required information and documentation.
- 32 **Sec. 5.** RCW 29A.08.110 and 2005 c 246 s 5 are each amended to read 33 as follows:
- 34 (1) An application is considered complete only if it contains the 35 <u>information required by RCW 29A.08.210 including, but not limited to,</u> 36 <u>the</u> applicant's <u>legal</u> name, complete valid residence address, date of 37 birth, signature attesting to the truth of the information provided, a 38 mark in the check-off box confirming United States citizenship, and an

indication that proof of citizenship and the provided driver's license number, state identification card number, or Social Security number ((has)) have been confirmed by the secretary of state. If it is not complete, the auditor shall promptly mail a verification notice of the deficiency to the applicant. This verification notice shall require the applicant to provide the missing information. If the verification notice is not returned by the applicant within forty-five days or is returned as undeliverable, the name of the applicant shall not be placed on the official list of registered voters until the applicant completes a new form and provides all required information and <u>documentation</u>. If the applicant provides the required verified information, the applicant shall be registered to vote as of the original date of mailing or date of delivery, whichever is applicable.

- (2) If the information required in subsection (1) of this section is complete, the applicant is considered to be registered to vote as of the original date of mailing or date of delivery, whichever is applicable. The auditor shall record the appropriate precinct identification, taxing district identification, and date of registration on the voter's record in the state voter registration list. Within forty-five days after the receipt of an application but no later than seven days before the next primary, special election, or general election, the auditor shall send to the applicant, by first class mail, an acknowledgement notice identifying the registrant's precinct and containing such other information as may be required by the secretary of state. The postal service shall be instructed not to forward a voter registration card to any other address and to return to the auditor any card which is not deliverable.
- (3) If an acknowledgement notice card is properly mailed as required by this section to the address listed by the voter as being the voter's mailing address and the notice is subsequently returned to the auditor by the postal service as being undeliverable to the voter at that address, the auditor shall promptly send the voter a confirmation notice. The auditor shall place the voter's registration on inactive status pending a response from the voter to the confirmation notice.

## Update Existing Registrations to Verify Eligibility

NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 29A.04 RCW to read as follows:

"PENDING STATUS." "Pending status" means the status of a voter who has not updated his or her registration information to the requirements of RCW 29A.08.210.

**Sec. 7.** RCW 29A.08.615 and 2003 c 111 s 238 are each amended to read as follows:

Registered voters are divided into ((two)) three categories, "active," "pending," and "inactive." All registered voters are classified as active, unless assigned to inactive or pending status by the county auditor.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. A new section is added to chapter 29A.08 RCW to read as follows:

REQUIREMENTS FOR UPDATING REGISTRATION. (1) The county auditor shall mail an update notice before January 31, 2008, to all voters who registered to vote before the effective date of this act. The county auditor shall mail subsequent update notices not less than once every six months until October 1, 2009, to registrants who have not updated their registrations.

- (2) Update notices must be on a form prescribed by, or approved by, the secretary of state and must require that the voter provide his or her full legal name and proof of United States citizenship to the county auditor, either in person or by mail, prior to October 1, 2009, in order to maintain an active registration. The notice must include a list of acceptable documents for proving citizenship.
- (3) On October 1, 2009, the county auditor shall reassign all voters to pending status who registered to vote before the effective date of this act and who have not provided their full legal name or proof of United States citizenship to the county auditor. The county auditor shall notify these voters of the status change, including in the notice an explanation of how to be returned to active status as described in subsection (4) of this section.
- (4) The county auditor shall return a voter who has been placed on pending status under this section to active voter status if the voter provides his or her full legal name and proof of citizenship to the county auditor. This may be done in person at the auditor's office; by mail in response to the update notice; by mail with an absentee or mail

- 1 ballot; or in person to a poll worker before voting at a poll site.
- 2 The county auditor shall mail an acknowledgment notice to a voter who
- 3 has updated their registration under this section. The acknowledgement
- 4 notice shall be processed in the same manner as in RCW 29A.08.110.
- 5 (5) Beginning on the date the voter was assigned to pending status 6 and ending on the day of the second general election for federal office 7 that occurs after the date that the voter was sent the status notice 8 required in subsection (3) of this section, if the voter fails to take
- 9 any of the actions described in subsection (4) of this section the
- 10 auditor shall cancel the person's voter registration.
- 11 (6) Any voter placed on pending status under this section who
- 12 attempts to vote without providing his or her full legal name and proof
- 13 of citizenship shall be issued a provisional ballot. The county
- 14 auditor shall not count the provisional ballot unless the voter
- 15 provides his or her full legal name and proof of citizenship to the
- 16 county auditor before the date the election is certified by the county.
- 17 Upon receiving this documentation the auditor shall return the voter to
- 18 active status as provided in subsection (3) of this section.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** RCW 29A.08.010 ("Information required for
- 20 voter registration.") and 2006 c 320 s 2, 2005 c 246 s 2, 2004 c 267 s
- 21 102, 2003 c 111 s 201, & 1994 c 57 s 9 are each repealed.

## 22 Construction, Severability, and Miscellaneous Provisions

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 10. CONSTRUCTION. The provisions of this act
- 24 are to be liberally construed to effectuate the intent, policies, and
- 25 purposes of this act.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 11. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this act
- 27 or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 28 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 29 persons or circumstances is not affected.
- 30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 12.** Subheadings and captions used in this act
- 31 are not part of the law.
- 32 NEW SECTION. Sec. 13. This act shall be known and cited as the
- 33 Restoring Integrity to Elections Act.
